AN ACT to Regulate Smoking in Retail Food Stores and Restaurants.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 MRSA c. 270 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 270
SMOKING IN FOOD STORES AND RESTAURANTS
§1681. Definitions
As used in this chapter, unless the context oth- erwise indicates, the following words have the fol- lowing meanings.
1. Restaurant. "Restaurant" means any enclosed indoor restaurant or other enclosed indoor establish- ment which invites the public to be served food for consumption on the premises.

1 2. Retail food store. "Retail food store" means 2 any store with a public area of 1,500 square feet or 3 more which sells articles used for food or drink for 4 consumption off the store's premises.
5 <u>3. Smoking. "Smoking" includes being in posses</u> 6 sion of or responsible for a lighted cigar, ciga- 7 rette, pipe or any other lighted smoking equipment.
8 §1682. Provision of signs
9 1. Restaurants. Restaurants shall display prom- 10 inently, at or near the entrance, a sign indicating 11 their policy on seating for smokers and nonsmokers, 12 and shall encourage their patrons to make their seat- 13 ing requests known.
<ul> <li>2. Retail food stores. Retail food stores shall</li> <li>display prominently, at or near the entrance, a sign</li> <li>notifying members of the public that no smoking is</li> <li>allowed.</li> </ul>
18 §1683. Provision of no-smoking area in restaurants
19 Restaurants shall provide a no-smoking area.
20 §1684. Smoking prohibited in retail food stores
21 <u>Smoking is prohibited in all retail food stores</u> 22 <u>as defined in this chapter.</u>
23 STATEMENT OF FACT
This bill accommodates the 63% of the Maine popu- lation that does not smoke by requiring that restau- rants provide a no smoking area for their patrons and post notice of their policy. The bill also provides smoking in retail food stores with a public area of 1,500 square feet or more and also requires posting of that policy.
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
