25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	This amendment clarifies that the dealer, in addition to any other rights which any such dealer may enjoy under the law, shall have the rights of a buyer under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 11, section 2-607, subsection (5). The dealer could thus give notice to the manufacturer of the litigation and notify the manufacturer that if it does not come in and defend against the suit, it will be bound by any court decision that affects the manufacturer as well as the dealer.
