AN ACT Relating to County Extension Work in Maine.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §191 is amended to read:
§191. Purpose
In order to aid in diffusing among the people of
this State useful and practical information on sub-
jects relating to agriculture, natural resources,
family living, youth development, community develop-
ment, home economics and rural life and to encourage
the application of the same, there may be inaugurated
in each of the several counties of the State exten-
sion work which shall be carried on in cooperation
with the Trustees of the University of Maine, College
ef Agriculture and the University of Maine at Orono.

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §192 is amended to read:

§192. Demonstrations and information

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Cooperative agricultural extension work shall consist of the giving of practical demonstrations in agriculture, natural resources, family living, youth development, community development and home economics and imparting information on said those subjects through field demonstrations, publications and otherwise. This work shall be carried on in each county in such manner as may be mutually agreed upon by the executive committee of the county extension association provided for in section 193, and the trustees of the University of Maine, Cellege of Agriculture the University of Maine at Orono, or their duly appointed representatives.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §193 is amended to read:

§193. County extension associations

For the purpose of carrying out this chapter, there may be created in each county or combination of counties within the State an organization to be known as a "county extension association," and its services available to all residents of a county. Such county extension association shall have adopted constitution and set of bylaws acceptable to the University of Maine, College of Agriculture, and they shall be recognized as the official body within that county or counties for carrying on extension work in agriculture, natural resources, family living, youth development, community development and home economics within said that county or counties and in cooperation with the University of Maine, Colof Agriculture at Orono, the county extension association is viewed as an integral part of county government, therefore its function and budget are treated as those of any other department. erganization The county extension association may make such regulations and bylaws for its government and the carrying on of its work as are not inconsistent with said that chapter, provided but that one such organization shall be formed in each county.

Sec. 4. 7 MRSA §194 is amended to read:

§194. Budget and taxes

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The executive committee of each county extension association shall annually prepare an annual financial budget for the 12 months beginning January next thereafter, showing in detail its estimate of the amount of money to be expended under this chapter within the county or counties for such 12 months, shall submit the same to a vote of the association at regular annual meeting and, if the budget is approved by a majority vote of the members of the association present at such meeting, the executive mittee shall submit the same to the board of county commissioners on a date in December approved by said county commissioners, and the county commissioners may, if they deem it justifiable, include the amount of this budget in the appropriations by them annually recommended, and levy a tax therefor. amount thus raised by direct taxation within any county or combination of counties for the purposes of this chapter shall be not less than \$1,000 annually per county extension agent provide for the salaries clerks, provision of office space, supplies, of equipment, postage, telephone, a contribution toward the salaries of county agents and such other expenses of county agents and such other expenses as necessary to maintain an efficient and effective county extension program. At the request of the county extension association made on the said date in December, the county commissioners of the county may allow an amount in excess of the minimum specified, which included in the budget and for which a tax shall be levied: These funds shall be used for the maintenance of the county extension service, including salaries of agents and elerks, office rental, supplies, equipment, postage, telephone and for such ether expenses as necessary to maintain an efficient and effective county extension service. Whenever the inhabitants of 2 counties shall unite for organization in one association, the amount of the tax sessed upon each county shall be in the proportion which the last state valuation in that county bears of the last state valuation in the 2 the total counties so united.

Sec. 5. 7 MRSA §195 is amended to read:

§195. Annual reports

It shall be the duty of each said county extension association, annually, on or before the 10th day of Becomber as required, to present its plan of extension work for the ensuing year and to render to both the trustees of the University of Maine, College of Agriculture, and the county commissioners a full detailed report of its extension activities for the preceding fiscal year, including a detailed report of its receipts and expenditures from all sources. The financial report of such county extension association shall be on such forms as may be prescribed by the trustees of the University of Maine, College of Agriculture at Orono.
