STATEMENT OF FACT

The need for adequate housing will dramatically increase over the next few years. Federally funded housing programs for the elderly have diminished dramatically over the past 4 years. The elderly population is growing at a faster rate than any other segment of society. This bill appropriates funds to the Bureau of Maine's Elderly to provide resource developers to area agencies on aging which will develop programs to meet the needs of Maine's older citizens, including shared housing, congregate housing and privately developed housing.

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
