11 STATEMENT OF FACT

Of the 381 community public water suppliers in the State, 288 rely upon ground water totally or in part as their source of supply. Recent Department of Human Services regulations require new utilities to provide a minimum ground water protection zone based upon the particular aquifer. Most public suppliers primarily own the land just around the well heads.

The Department of Human Services does not review and require the revision of the source protection plans of water utilities on a regular basis. This bill requires the submission of plans, their periodic review and, where necessary, their revision. The bill provides for funding for a new position in the Department of Human Services Drinking Water Program which, in addition to reviewing source protection plans, provides assistance to water utilities in developing adequate plans for long-term supply.
