This bill involves the reallocation of \$4,341 of SOHIO oil overcharge funds for use by the Rideshare Program to help maintain the rideshare coordinator position and cover some program expenses in order to ensure that this important transportation conservation program continues. These funds had been allocated previously for use by the Rideshare Program for the past fiscal year and have lapsed back to the General Fund. These funds must be used for oil conservation orientated purposes.

This bill also involves the allocation of \$4,037 of interest on the recently received AMOCO overcharge refunds. These funds will be added to the previously allocated AMOCO money to conduct energy audits on residential care facilities that receive state assistance or whose clients receive state assistance. The interest on the AMOCO funds is currently in a special revenue account.

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
