7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 314, L.D. 403,
8 Bill, "AN ACT to Allow Educational Institutions with-
9 in the State to Purchase State Surplus Property."

10 Amend the bill in section 2, subsection 6, in the
11 13th line (page 2, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out
12 the underlined words "or educational institutions"
13 and in the 7th line from the end (page 2, line 15 in
14 L.D.) by inserting after the word "subdivision" the
15 following: 'or educational institution'

16 Further amend the bill in section 3, in that part
17 designated "§1813-A." by striking out all of subsec-
18 tion 1 (page 2, lines 27 to 30 in L.D.) and inserting
19 in its place the following:

20 '1. Educational institution. "Educational in-
21 stitution" means any public elementary or secondary
22 school; any elementary or secondary private school
23 approved for tuition whose school enrollment is at
24 least 60% publicly-funded students as determined by
25 the previous school year's October to April average
26 enrollment; any nonpublic post-secondary school; or
any vocational region.'

27 STATEMENT OF FACT

28 The purpose of this amendment is to authorize
29 private secular schools to purchase state surplus
30 property. This amendment limits this privilege to
31 private secular schools approved by the State for tu-
32 ition. Currently public schools are authorized to
33 purchase state surplus property.
