The State Lotteries shall be under the immediate supervision and direction of a director, who shall be a person qualified by training and experience to direct the State Lotteries. The director shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over matters relating to legal affairs and to confirmation by the Senate, and shall serve during the pleasure of the Governor. Any vacancy occurring in the office of the director shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

## 20 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require the Commissioners and the Director of State Lotteries to be confirmed by the Legislature. The State Lottery Commission is responsible for operating a business which for fiscal year 1984 grossed roughly \$16,000,000 of which nearly \$8,000,000 was allocated for prize moneys and \$4,500,000 was deposited in the General Fund.

The State has developed an informal policy that requires Legislative confirmation of commissioners and directors of agencies which render decisions that have a significant impact upon the State and are involved with significant amounts of State revenues. Some of the agencies requiring legislative confirmation include:

- 1. The State Board of Education;
- 2. The State Personnel Board;
  - 3. The Maine Health Care Finance Commission;

3	6. The Board of Environmental Protection;
