COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 152, L.D. 419,
Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Habitual Offender Law."

Amend the Bill in section 3 by striking out all
of subsection 4 and inserting in its place the fol-
lowing:

'4. Eligibility. A person is not eligible for a
license under this section if one or more of the con-
victions or adjudications upon which his habitual of-
fender status is based is under:

A. Section 2292, subsection 1, paragraph A; or

B. Section 2292, subsection 1, paragraph B, if
the person has not completed the periods of sus-
pension required in accordance with section
1311-A, 1312-B or 1312-D and unless the Secretary
of State has received written notice that the
person has satisfactorily completed the alcohol
educational program of the Department of Human
Services and, when required, has satisfactorily
completed an alcohol treatment or rehabilitation
program approved or licensed by the department.
The license shall contain the condition that the
person abstain from the use of intoxicating li-
quor.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment makes it clear that a person whose
license is revoked under the habitual offender law is
not eligible for a work-restricted license if one or
more of the convictions or adjudications was an of-
fense of criminal homicide, nor is that person eligi-
