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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The intent of this bill is to eliminate the Maine Criminal Justice Academy attendance as a prerequisite for licensing of former law enforcement officers as private investigators since the major part of the curriculum at the academy is not pertinent to the duties and responsibilities of those engaged in private investigation.

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
