Whereas, the higher wholesale price will force small retail establishments to charge more for milk offered for sale in the stores; and

4 Whereas, this volume determined pricing schedule 5 is bound to cause economic difficulties for small 6 stores to maintain their clientele and serve their 7 communities; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 9 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 10 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 11 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-12 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 13 therefore, be it

14 Price order; modification. Resolved: Maine Milk 15 Commission order 85-2 as promulgated by the commis-16 sion shall become effective on February 3, 1985, ex-17 cept that the order, which includes its appendices, 18 is modified to the following extent.

19 1. The volume discount price schedule and the 20 phase-in period associated with it shall not become 21 effective.

22 2. Effective February 3, 1985, drop shipment 23 minimum wholesale prices to dealers for whole milk, 24 lowfat milk and skim milk sold in various size con-25 tainers, regardless of the volume delivered, shall be 26 the prices for those containers as they would have 27 been established under order 85-2 at full implementa-28 tion for delivery in lots of 66 cases or more.

For full service deliveries, these prices shall be increased by the following amounts: Six cents per gallon; 4¢ per 3-quart container; 3¢ per half-gallon; c per quart; and 30¢ per bulk 20-quart container.

In all other respects, order 85-2 shall remain as
adopted by the Maine Milk Commission.

The commission shall prepare and file with the Secretary of State a supplement to order 85-2 which shall reflect the changes made to the order by this resolve. The Secretary of State shall file the supplement with order 85-2. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 8003, the prepara tion, issuance and filing of the supplement shall not
be subject to the rule-making requirements of the
Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter
375.

6 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 7 in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when 8 approved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

10 This resolve modifies the Maine Milk Commission 11 order 85-2 by replacing the volume discount wholesale 12 pricing established in order 85-2 with a single 13 wholesale minimum price which does not vary with the 14 volume of milk delivered. The price differentials 15 for full service delivery are applied to this single 16 minimum wholesale price.

17 In all other respects, order 85-2 remains as 18 adopted by the commission. Differential pricing for 19 lowfat and skim milk as adopted in order 85-2 re-20 mains, and the raw product price will continue to be 21 set monthly by the commission.

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
