- 2. Disability retirement allowance recipients. If any recipient of a disability retirement allowance is restored to service, and if the total of his monthly retirement allowance for any year and his total earnable compensation for that year exceeds his average final compensation at retirement, subject to the percentage adjustments that have been received under section 1128, the excess shall be deducted from the disability retirement allowance payments during the next calendar year. Those deductions shall be prorated on a monthly basis over the year or part of the year for which benefits are received in an equitable manner prescribed by the board of trustees. The disability retirement allowance recipient shall be responsible for reimbursing the Maine State tirement System for any excess payments not so deducted. If the retirement allowance payments are thereby eliminated, the recipient shall again become a member of the retirement system and he shall contribute thereafter at the current rate. When that member subsequently again retires, he shall receive such benefits as may be computed on his entire creditable service and in accordance with the then existing law.
- 3. Service retirement allowance recipient. If any recipient of a service retirement allowance is restored to service, and if the total of his monthly retirement allowance for any year and his total earnable compensation for that year exceeds his average final compensation at retirement, subject to percentage adjustments that have been received under section 1128, the excess shall be deducted from the service retirement allowance payments during the next calendar year. Those deductions shall be prorated on a monthly basis over the year or part of the year for which benefits are received in an equitable manner prescribed by the board of trustees. The service retirement allowance recipient shall be responsible for reimbursing the Maine State Retirement System for any excess payments not so deducted. If the retirement allowance payments are eliminated, he shall again become a member of the retirement system and he shall contribute thereafter at the current rate and when

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies the provisions of the Maine 6 Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1123, "restoration to service", by separating it into 3 subsections. 7 8 The bill defines the term "restoration to service" 9 which is not in the present law. The bill also deals 10 11 with earnings limits on persons restored to service 12 who are on disability or service retirement. for state employee and bill retains the exemption 13 14 teacher retirees who become members of the Legislature, but removes the exemption for those retirees 15 who become employees of the Legislature. 16
