COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 333, L.D. 448,
Bill, "AN ACT Relating to the Membership of and the
Payment of Per Diem to Boards."

Amend the bill in section 1, in paragraph A, sub-
paragraph (1) (page 1, line 30 in L.D.) by striking
out the underlined phrase "\$50/Day" and inserting in
its place the underlined words 'Legislative per diem'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the
statement of fact a new section to read:

'Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §3972, first ¶, as amended by
PL 1983, c. 812, §236, is further amended to read:

The board shall meet at least once a year to con-
duct its business and elect its officers. Additional
meetings shall be held as necessary to conduct the
business of the board, and may be convened at the
call of the chairman or a majority of the board mem-
bers. Annually, the members shall elect from their
number a chairman, a secretary who shall be a certi-
fied public accountant and a treasurer. The offices
of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same
person. The board may adopt a seal. ~~Four~~ Three mem-
bers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
business. All fees and other moneys collected by
the board shall be promptly transmitted by the trea-
surer of the board to the Treasurer of State, togeth-
er with an account of these receipts. The moneys are
to be used only for expenses of the board upon requi-
sition drawn on the State Controller. Each member of
the board shall be compensated according to Title 5,
chapter 379. If receipts of the board are not suffi-
cient to cover all expenses and compensation of the
board, the board may reduce equitably the compensa-
tion of its individual members.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 333, L.D. 448

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment corrects an oversight in the orig-
3 inal bill which reduced the membership of the Board
4 of Accountancy from 7 to 5 members but did not reduce
5 the number of members necessary for a quorum. This
6 amendment reduces the number from 4 to 3 members nec-
7 essary for a quorum. In addition, this amendment
8 changes the rate of compensation paid to board mem-
9 bers with professional license money from \$50/day to
10 legislative per diem.

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
