Aroostook County is currently served by a total of 6 District Court locations, 3 of which are located in the St. John Valley, all within a single Judicial Division. Van Buren is the smallest court in the State, reporting only 301 case filings during 1983. Collectively, Fort Kent, Madawaska and Van Buren processed 2,833 cases during 1983, representing a 53.6% decrease from the 4,352 cases in 1979. Based upon data collected for the first 11 months of 1984, it appears that the 1984 filing will not exceed 2,400. These courts employ 3.5 employees, resulting in a cases-per-employee ratio in 1983 of 809, compared to a statewide average of 1,802 cases per employee. All 3 court facilities are inadequate and are not accessible to the handicapped.

Fort Kent appears to be the logical site for the consolidation of Madawaska's caseload. It is centrally located, would be convenient to the bulk of the valley's population and is only 20 miles from Madawaska. Since Van Buren is only 22 miles from Caribou, its caseload could readily be transferred to Caribou. The addition of Van Buren's small caseload should have no impact upon Caribou's staff or facility.

In 1983, Bar Harbor became the 2nd smallest court in the State, reporting a total of 1,186 case filings for the entire year, with the summer months of June, July and August accounting for almost 40% of the year's caseload. The clerk of court in Ellsworth also serves as the Bar Harbor clerk, although an associate clerk who is supervised by the Ellsworth clerk of court actually staffs the Bar Harbor office.

With only one employee, the number of cases in 1983, 1 1,186, still was well below the statewide average of 1,802 cases per employee. The court facility is not 2 3 4 accessible to the handicapped. Bar Harbor is located 20 miles from Ellsworth, and over 1 1/2 of all liti-5 6 gants in the Bar Harbor court were represented by members of the Ellsworth bar. It does not appear 7 that closing the Bar Harbor court location and trans-8 9 ferring its caseload to Ellsworth will adversely affect the citizens of Hancock County. 10
