Since 1981, the Legislature finds that the bureau has gradually increased the staff responsible for performing administrative functions and decreased the staff providing direct field service.

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Sec. 2. Report required. The Commissioner of Conservation shall prepare a proposal to reallocate existing forest management and utilization resources within the Bureau of Forestry to strengthen direct in-the-field services to forest landowners and diminish administrative functions in order to encourage the development, management and protection of private nonindustrial forest lands.

The purpose of the reallocation of existing resources shall be to encourage landowners to apply practices that will provide for forestation of suitable open lands, reforestation of cut over or other nonstocked or understocked forest lands, timber stand improvement practices, including thinning, prescribed burning and other silvicultural treatments, and forest resources management and production.

The proposal shall be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and natural resources during the first week of the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.

- l. Existing resources to be considered in the reallocation proposal. The report shall specifically consider reallocating existing resources within the Division of Forest Management, including its component programs of utilization and marketing, urban and community forestry and assessment and utilization, as well as the bureau's administration, especially its planning, evaluation and research functions. All personnel funded in these areas and all related federal accounts shall be considered in this reallocation plan.
- 2. Areas to be included. The proposal shall include, but not be limited to, strengthening the bureau's provision of direct services in the following areas:
 - A. Timber stand improvement;
