at the time of appointment. Of the 7 professional nurse members, future vacancies shall be filled so that at least 2 members have had prior administrative and supervisory experience, one in an intermediate care facility and one in an acute care facility. One member shall be a licensed practical nurse. One member shall be a representative of the public. Except to fill vacancies in unexpired terms, all appointments shall be for a term of 5 years after such appointment or until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified. No person may be eligible for more than one reappointment. Any public member vacancy on the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by the appointment of another public member by the Governor.

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Each appointment of a professional nurse shall be made from a at the sole discretion of the Governor, subject to the provisions of this section. In making those appointments, the Governor may consider any list of 3 candidates, qualified as provided, and selected by the presidents or designees of statewide Maine nursing organizations with national affiliation and provider groups, including, but not limited to, the Maine Health Care Association and the Maine Hospital Association and submitted to the Governor by the President of the Maine State Nurses' Association not less than 60 days before the time of appointment. Any professional nurse vacancy occurring on the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment made by the Governor from like considering nominations submitted by the President of the Maine State Nurses' Association in the manner described in this paragraph.

Each appointment of a practical nurse shall made from a at the sole discretion of the Governor, subject to the provisions of this section. In making such appointments, the Governor may consider any list of 3 candidates, qualified as provided, and selected the presidents or designees of statewide Maine nursing organizations with national affiliation and provider groups, including, but not limited to, the Maine Health Care Association and the Maine Hospital and submitted to the Governor by the Association President of the Maine Licensed Practical Nurses' Association not less than 60 days before the time

appointment. Any practical nurse vacancy occurring on the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment to be made by the Governor from like , after considering nominations submitted by the President of the Maine Licensed Practical Nurses' Association in the manner set out in this paragraph.

The In order to receive consideration by the Governor, the President of the Maine State Nurses' Association shall eall a meeting of the presidents or designees submit lists of proposed names not less than 90 days prior to the expiration of the term of each professional nurse and practical nurse member of the board.

The Governor may remove any member from the board for cause.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

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- 17 This bill amends existing law to:
- 18 1. Provide greater discretion to the Governor in making appointments to the State Board of Nursing.
 20 Under current law, the Governor is restricted in making his professional nurse appointments solely from lists submitted by the President of the Maine State Nurses' Association;
- 24 2. Increase membership of board from 7 members to 9 members;
 - 3. Require that 2 of the 7 professional nurses be selected from individuals with supervisory and administrative experience, one with a nursing home background and one with a hospital background; and
- 30 4. Allow provider groups to submit names for the 31 Governor's consideration.

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
