the director and the member, be submitted as evidence of that employee's health. Any such medical examination or tests shall be conducted at a place mutually agreed upon and the costs thereof shall be paid by the retirement system. This statement of health or medical examination or test result shall only be utilized in determining eligibility for a disability retirement allowance pursuant to paragraph A. Any member subject to this paragraph who does not submit a statement of health as required, prior to his application for disability benefits in accordance with this section, will not be eligible for those benefits unless he establishes to the satisfaction of the executive director that he meets the qualifications of paragraph A.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This proposed wording parallels the construction of the existing provision for a continuance of disability retirement allowance and requires that medical examinations or tests required by the Executive Director of the Maine State Retirement System for initial eligibility for disability also be performed by a qualified physician.

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
