24 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
25 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
26 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

27 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-
28 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

29 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-
30 dent to the operation of the department will become
31 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985;
32 and

33 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
34 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
35 the Constitution of Maine and require the following

1 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 **Sec. 1. Allocation of Maine Hazardous Waste Fund.** Income to the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, and from July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

22 **Sec. 2. Allocation of Low-level Waste Siting Fund.** Income to the Low-level Waste Siting Fund for the fiscal year from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

33 **Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations.** Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be neces-

1 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legisla-
2 ture and those reclassifications or range changes
3 which have been approved by the Department of Person-
4 nel and submitted for legislative review prior to the
5 effective date of this Act.

6 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited
7 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1,
8 1985.

9 STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The purpose of this bill is to make allocations
11 from the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for the fiscal
12 years ending June 30, 1986, and June 30, 1987, and to
13 make allocations from the Low-level Waste Siting Fund
14 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986.

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
