Any resident of the 11 Passamaquoddy Indian territory or the Penobscot Indi-12 an territory who is not a member of the respective 13 tribe or nation nonetheless shall be equally entitled 14 to receive any municipal or governmental services 15 provided by the respective tribe or nation or by the 16 State, except those services which are provided exclusively to members of the respective tribe or na-17 18 tion pursuant to state or federal law, and shall be 19 entitled to vote in national, state and county elec-20 tions in the same manner as any tribal member resid-21 ing within Indian territory.

22 Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall not be effective unless, within 60 days of the adjournment 23 of the Legislature, the Secretary of State receives 24 25 written certification by the governor and council of 26 the Penobscot Nation that the nation has agreed to the provisions of this Act pursuant to the United 27 28 States Code, Title 25, Section 1725(e)(1), copies of which shall be submitted by the Secretary of State, Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of 29 30 31 Representatives, provided that in no event shall this 32 Act become effective until 90 days after adjournment 33 of the Legislature.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the Implementing Act to provide that Indian Tribal Governments could continue to conduct Beano games to raise revenue for municipal and tribal purposes as they have been doing for many years, until the recent State Supreme Court decision.

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
