1 review investigation or proceeding conducted by the 2 committee, if the society or association, committee member, staff person, witness or consultant acted in 3 4 good faith within the scope of the function of the 5 committee; made a reasonable effort to obtain the 6 facts of the matter as to which the society, associa-7 tion or he acts; and acts in the reasonable belief 8 that the action taken was warranted by the facts.

9 Any entity, organization or person acting without 10 malice in making any report or other information 11 available to the peer review committee or who assists 12 in the origination, investigation or preparation of 13 that information, or assists the committee in carry-14 ing out any of its duties or functions, shall be im-15 mune from civil or criminal liability for any such 16 actions.

17 Any communications or information relating to peer review committee investigations or proceedings 18 19 and the proceedings and records of the peer review committee related to investigations or proceedings 20 shall be held in confidence and shall not be subject 21 22 to discovery or introduced into evidence in any civil 23 action against a dentist arising out of matters which 24 are the subject of evaluation and review by the peer 25 review committee. No person who was in attendance at 26 a meeting of the peer review committee may be permit-27 ted or required to testify in any such civil action 28 as to any evidence or other matters produced or pre-29 sented during the meeting of the peer review committee or as to any findings, recommendations, evalua-30 31 tions, opinions or other actions of the peer review 32 committee or any members of the committee or consul-tants to the committee. Information, documents or 33 34 records otherwise available from original sources are 35 not to be construed as immune from discovery or use 36 in any such civil action merely because they were 37 presented during proceedings of the peer review com-38 mittee and any documents or records which have been 39 presented to the peer review committee by any witness shall be returned to the witness, if requested by him or if ordered to be produced by a court of competent 40 41 42 jurisdiction in any action, with copies of documents 43 or records to be retained by the peer review commit-44 tee at its discretion. Any person who testifies be-45 fore the peer review committee may not be asked about

1	his testimony before the peer review committee or
2	opinions formed by him as a result of the hearings.
3	STATEMENT OF FACT
4 5 6 7 8	This bill provides for immunity in civil and criminal actions for dental peer review committee members and staff members, witnesses, consultants and those who provide information to those committees or cooperate with those committees.
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
