If this Act is approved by any county under section 2, the Legislature shall, prior to January 1 1987, enact legislation, to take effect on January 1 1987, assigning the current functions, duties and powers of that county government to appropriate state and municipal departments and agencies and exception that county from the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, Part 1.
30 31 32 33 34 35 36	Sec. 2. Referendum. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of each county within the State at an election to be held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The board of commissioners in each count is authorized to expend those funds which are necessary to implement the referendum.

The county clerk shall prepare the required bal-

lots in which he shall state the subject matter of this Act in the following question:
"Shall the county offices of commissioner and treasurer be dissolved and all existing functions and duties be transferred to the appropriate state and municipal departments and agencies?"
7 The voters in each county shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the question.
The results of the vote in each county shall be declared by the board of commissioners for that county and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the county clerk with the Secretary of State.
This Act shall be deemed approved in any county upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters in that county voting at that election.'
17 STATEMENT OF FACT
The purpose of this amendment is to allow the voters of each county to decide if they wish to abolish the county offices of commissioner and treasurer and transfer all existing functions and duties to the appropriate state and municipal departments and agencies.
