IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
Resolve, Establishing a Commission to Review Upper Management in State Government.
Preamble. Whereas, The Legislature has become increasingly concerned about which State Government officials should be appointed and under what terms; and
Whereas, the Legislature's only comprehensive evaluation of policy positions was completed in 1976; and
Whereas, the Legislature has an obligation to determine which positions should be responsive to public policy; now, therefore, be it
Commission established. Resolved: That a public commission shall be established to study and examine the policy-making, policy-influencing and management positions in State Government to include directors, executive directors, bureau chiefs and other positions as appropriate: and be it further

Membership. Resolved: That the commission shall be comprised of 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2 members appointed by the President of the Senate; and 2 members appointed by the Governor; and be it further

Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall develop a policy and criteria to determine which positions are appointed and which positions constitute "management" in order to promote efficient, responsible and responsive operation of State Government; and be it further

Reports. Resolved: That the commission shall report its findings and recommendations, together with all necessary implementing legislation in accordance with the Joint Rules, to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature; and be it further

Copies of resolve forwarded. Resolved: That suitable copies of this resolve be forwarded to the Joint Standing Committee on State Government, the Governor and the Department of Personnel.

21 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is to establish a public commission to study the policy-making, policy-influencing and management positions in State Government. The commission shall report to the Second Regular Session of the 112 Legislature.
