AN ACT to Regulate the Drilling of Wells.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 MRSA §2610 is enacted to read:
§2610. Drilled water supply wells; minimum distance
After the effective date of this section, no person may drill a water supply well within 150 feet of any existing water supply well owned by a person other then the person for whom the well is being drilled.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

1

This bill lessens the possibility of the drilling of one well effecting the water level in adjacent wells. It requires a minimum distance of 150 feet between all drilled wells.
