	26 27 28 29 30	1. Grant established. A state funded Faculty and Instructors Recognition Grant in the amount of \$50,000 is established to recognize faculty and instructors at the vocational-technical institutes in the 1985-86 academic year. These grants are to be
	31	awarded in addition to, and not in lieu of, any nego-
	32 33	tiated contract between the State Board of Education and the bargaining agent of the faculty and instruc-
	34	tors' bargaining unit.

- 2. Distribution criteria. The standards and criteria to be utilized for distribution of grants to vocational-technical institute faculty and instructors shall be mutually agreed upon between the State Board of Education and the bargaining agent representing the faculty and instructors' bargaining unit at the vocational-technical institutes.
 - 3. Award of grants. The faculty and instructor recognition grants shall be awarded in accordance with the standards and criteria agreed upon in subsection 2, upon written notification by the State Board of Education to the Treasurer of State certifying to whom and in what amount the grants are to be made.
 - 4. Grants not considered in collective bargaining. The state funded recognition grants shall not be considered during collective bargaining for the purposes of setting faculty and instructors' salaries.

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill recognizes the contributions of the faculty and instructors at the post-secondary vocational-technical institutes in furthering the knowledge and skills of the citizens of Maine.
