31	§3071. Division of Deafness

1	There is established the Division of Deafness
2	within the Department of Human Services, Bureau of
3	Rehabilitation.
4	§3072. Definitions
5	As used in this chapter, unless the context indi-
6	cates otherwise, the following terms have the follow-
7	ing meanings.
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8	1. Advisory committee. "Advisory committee"
9	means the advisory committee for the Division of
10	Deafness.
11	2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Com-
12	missioner of Human Services.
13	3. Deaf or deafness. "Deaf or deafness" means a
14	hearing handicap in which the sense of hearing is
15	nonfunctional for the purpose of ordinary communica-
16	
10	tion.
17	4. Hearing impairment. "Hearing impairment"
18	means a hearing handicap in which the sense of hear-
19	ing is defective, but still functional, with or with-
20	out amplification.
21	5 Statewide registry "Statewide registry"
22	5. Statewide registry. "Statewide registry" means a current listing, developed in cooperation
23	with various registries throughout the State of
24	with various registries throughout the State, of those persons in the State who are handicapped by
25	deafness or hearing impairment.

26	§3073. Powers and duties
27	In order to provide services and information to
28	the deaf and hearing impaired, the Division of Deaf-
29	ness, as authorized by the Director of the Bureau of
30	Rehabilitation, shall have the power and duty to work
31	toward the following objectives:
32	1. Provide advocacy. To provide cooperative
33	agreements or coordinate with agencies or community

	resources to provide advocacy for the rights of the
35	deaf and hearing impaired in the areas of employment,
36	education, legal aid, health care, social services,
37	finance, housing and other personal assistance while
38	avoiding duplication of effort in these areas;

1 2. Statewide registry. To maintain, coordinate 2 and update a statewide registry of the deaf and hear-3 ing impaired as is developed in cooperation with various registries throughout the State, use of 4 this 5 list being restricted to section 3062; 6 3. Information and referral. To provide informa-7 tion and referral services to deaf and hearing im-8 paired and their families on questions related to 9 their disorder; 10 4. Develop objectives. To develop a plan with goals and objectives for development, planning and 11 12 implementation within a framework for greater cooperation and coordination among agencies and organiza-13 14 tions now serving or having the potential to serve 15 the deaf and hearing impaired; 5. Community service center. To continue to 16 17 study the need to establish, maintain and fund at 18 least one community service center where deaf and hearing impaired and their families can receive per-19 tinent information relating to the coordination of 20 21 services that each requires; 22 6. Promote accessibility. To promote accessibil-23 ity to all governmental services for Maine residents 24 who are deaf or hearing impaired; and 7. Recommendations. To make recommendations to 25 the Governor, the joint standing committee of the 26 27 Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources 28 with respect to modifications in existing services or 29 establishment of additional services for the deaf and 30 hearing impaired and their families. 31 §3074. Advisory committee 32 There shall be within the Department of Human 33 Services, Bureau of Rehabilitation, Division of Deafness, an advisory committee consisting of 23 members 34 35 and 3 nonvoting member-at-large positions to be ap-36 pointed by the Director of the Bureau of Rehabilitation, in conjunction with the Director of the Divi-37 38 sion of Deafness and representing equally consumers, professionals and the public. Members shall be com-39 pensated according to the provisions of Title 5, 40 41 chapter 379.

1	The Director of the Bureau of Rehabilitation, in
2	conjunction with the Director of the Division of
3	Deafness, shall appoint, from the advisory committee,
4	a chairman and vice-chairman to serve 2-year terms.
5	The committee shall meet at the call of the chairman
6	but not less than 4 times during a calendar year. The
7	chairman may delegate, as necessary, duties to mem-
8	bers to carry out the functions of the committee.
9	§3075. Advisory committee; powers and duties
10	The advisory committee shall advise the Director
11	of the Bureau of Rehabilitation and the Director of
12	the Division of Deafness and shall prepare an annual
13	report which shall be a public document to the extent
14	that it complies with section 3062. The report shall
15	include, but not be limited to:
16 17	1. Review. Review of the status of services to the deaf and hearing impaired;
18	2. Recommendations. Recommendations for priori-
19	ties for the development and coordination of services
20	to the deaf and hearing impaired;
21	3. Evaluation. An evaluation of the progress
22	made as the result of any recommendations made in the
23	preceding report of the chairman;
24 25 26	4. Statement of goals. A statement of goals for activities of the division during the next following fiscal year; and
27	5. Implementation of functions. The steps to be
28	taken by the division to implement the functions
29	listed in section 3073.
30	§3076. Director of the Division of Deafness
31	1. Director. The Director of the Bureau of Reha-
32	bilitation shall appoint a Director of the Division
33	of Deafness, who shall be responsible for administer-
34	ing the Division of Deafness and its programs and po-
35	licies, including generating and seeking out finan-
36	cial aid, grants and money.

1	2. Director of the Division of Deafness; staff;
2	qualifications. Both the Director of the Division of
3	Deafness and staff must be knowledgeable of the needs
4	of the deaf and hearing impaired and possess the
5	ability to communicate on a meaningful basis with
6	those handicapped persons.

STATEMENT OF FACT

8 The purpose of this bill is to establish the Di-9 vision of Deafness under the Department of Human Ser-10 vices, Bureau of Rehabilitation.

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11 The lack of accessibility to the Department of 12 Human Services continues to remain a critical barrier 13 to the deaf community. Agencies often lack adequate 14 understanding and sensitivity to the inherent commu-15 nications problems and subsequent educational, psy-16 chological and social ramifications of deafness.

17 Since 1974 the Bureau of Rehabilitation has pro-18 vided essential leadership in establishing necessary 19 services for the deaf and hearing impaired other than 20 those generally provided by the vocational rehabili-21 tation program. The Division of Deafness currently 22 rehabilitation services, interprovides vocational 23 preter services, telecommunications devices for the 24 deaf, identification cards for individuals and hear-25 ing ear dogs, a registry of deaf persons, information 26 and referral and advocacy on behalf of deaf persons.

This bill helps to strengthen the mission of the Division of Deafness through coordination of resources and the shaping of the responsibilities of other existing public and private programs.

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
