18 AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations from
19 the Transportation Safety Fund for the
20 Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1986, and

23 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
24 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
25 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

26 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-
27 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

28 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-
29 dent to the operation of the department will become
30 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985;
31 and

32 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
33 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
34 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
35 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

1 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
2 therefore,

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
4 follows:

5 Sec. 1. Supplemental allocation of Transporta-
6 tion Safety Fund. Income to the Transportation Safe-
7 ty Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1,
8 1985, to June 30, 1986, and from July 1, 1986, to
9 June 30, 1987, shall be segregated, apportioned and
10 disbursed as designated in the following schedule.
