19 the Federal Block Grant Fund for the  
20 Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1985.

22 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
23 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
24 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

25 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
26 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

27 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will  
28 become due and payable prior to June 30, 1985; and

29 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
30 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of  
31 the Constitution of Maine and require the following  
32 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-  
33 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
34 therefore,

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
2 follows:

3 Sec. 1. Additional allocation of Federal Block  
4 Grant Fund. Income to the Federal Block Grant Fund  
5 for the fiscal year from July 1, 1984, to June 30,  
6 1985, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed  
7 as designated in the following schedule.

25       Sec. 2. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations  
26 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-  
27 ficer, with the approval of the Governor, to specifi-  
28 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-  
29 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legisla-  
30 ture and those reclassifications or range changes  
31 which have been approved by the Department of Person-  
32 nel and submitted for legislative review prior to the  
33 effective date of this Act.

34       Sec. 3. Encumbered balance at year end. At the  
35 end of the fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall  
36 not be carried more than once.

37       Emergency clause. In view of the emergency

1 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect  
2 when approved.

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

4 The purpose of this bill is to make additional  
5 allocations of the Federal Block Grant Fund for the  
6 fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.
