AN ACT to Provide for Public Rest Rooms in Eating Places.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 MRSA c. 270 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 270
PUBLIC REST ROOM FACILITIES
§1671. Public rest room facilities required
On or after May 1, 1986, in any retail eating establishment where food or drink is served to the public for consumption on the premises, there shall be installed a minimum of 2 toilets for the use of the public. These toilets shall be clearly marked and

2 3 4	The Department of Human Services may, for the purpose of protecting the public health, make rules interpreting and enforcing this chapter.
5	§1673. Enforcement
6 7 8 9 10	This chapter shall be enforced by the Division of Health Engineering. Anyone violating this chapter or regulations promulgated under this chapter commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged.
11	STATEMENT OF FACT
12 13 14	The purpose of this bill is to require eating establishments which serve food for on-premise consumption to provide public toilets, free of charge.
