STATEMENT OF FACT

21 Current law exempts borrow pits for sand, fill or gravel covering up to 5 acres from regulation by the 22 23 Site Location of Development Law. This bill elimi-24 nates the exemption for borrow pits used for commer-25 cial purposes, unless the pit is regulated by the De-26 partment of Transportation and the Maine Land Use 27 Regulation Commission. Pits for personal use would be exempted. 28

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
