18 <b>19</b>	AN ACT to Expedite Legislative Sessions.
20 21 22	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
23 24 25 26 27	Whereas, the Constitution of Maine in Article IV, Part Third, Section 1, empowers the Legislature to establish appropriate statutory limits on the length of the first and 2nd regular legislative sessions; and
28 29 30	Whereas, the people of the State are entitled to expect that their elected representatives will deal with the legislative business expeditiously; and
31 32 33 34 35 36	Whereas, the establishment of a date certain for the adjourning of the Legislature will provide the legislators, the legislative staff, the Executive De- partment, the Judicial Department and the public with a clear time frame for the conduct of the business of the people; and

1 Whereas, the length of the legislative session is 2 directly related to the expenditure of the public 3 fisc and the shortening of the length of the sessions 4 will result in a substantial savings to the public 5 fisc, as substantial savings can be realized if this 6 legislation is effective now; and

7 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 8 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 9 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 10 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-11 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 therefore,

13 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 14 follows:

15 3 MRSA §2, 2nd ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 16 1975, c. 750, §1, is amended to read:

17 The first regular session of the Legislature after its convening shall adjourn no later than 100 18 19 legislative days after its convening the Friday preceding Memorial Day and the 2nd regular session of the Legislature after its convening shall adjourn no 20 21 22 later than 50 legislative days after its convening 23 March 31st. The Legislature, in case of emergency, a vote of 2/3 of the members of each House 24 may by 25 present and voting, extend the date for adjournment 26 for the first or 2nd regular session by no more than 27 5 legislative days, and in case of further emergency, 28 may by a vote of 2/3 of the members of each House 29 present and voting, further extend the date for ad-30 journment by 5 additional legislative days excluding 31 Saturday, Sunday and holidays, to occur within 15 32 calendar days. The times for adjournment for the 33 first and 2nd regular sessions may also be extended 34 for one additional legislative day, which need not be 35 a consecutive day, for the purpose of considering 36 possible objections of the Governor to any bill or 37 resolution presented to him by the Legislature under the Constitution of Maine, Article IV, Part Third, 38 39 Section 2.

40 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 41 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-42 proved.

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6 7 8	The purpose of this bill to expedite legislative sessions by setting a date by which the Legislature must adjourn with provision for emergency up to 15 additional calendar days. This procedure will remove the tolling of legislative days during this period and give the Legislature more flexibility in utiliz- ing the time.
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
