28	§8151. Interdepartmental committee created
29 30 31 32 33	There is established an interdepartmental committee known as the Children's Residential Treatment Committee, to jointly develop and coordinate the State's role in contracting for the placement and treatment of children in residential treatment centers. The committee shall be composed of the Commis-

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- sioner of Educational and Cultural Services; the Commissioner of Human Services; the Commissioner of Men-
- 3 tal Health and Mental Retardation; and the Commis-
- 4 sioner of Corrections, or their designees.
- 5 §8152. Duties
- 6 The Children's Residential Treatment Committee 7 shall develop and promulgate rules to:
- 8 1. Policy. Develop an overall state policy for treatment of children in need of placement in residential treatment centers;
- 11 2. Need. Determine the need for the number of 12 placement of children in residential treatment cen-13 ters;
- 3. Contract procedures. Develop contract procedures for the provision of these services by nonstate agencies; and
- 17 4. Rates. Establish rates for the placement of children in residential treatment centers.
- 19 §8153. Contracts
- Any contracts entered into by the State on the placement of children into residential treatment centers must state the reasons for the number of children being contracted for and the basis for the rate established for payment.
- 25 §8154. Residential Treatment Centers Advisory Group
- The Residential Treatment Centers Advisory Group
 as established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection
 10, shall consist of a representative from each residential treatment center and 2 members who represent
 community mental health services. All members shall
 be selected annually by the committee. The committee
 shall meet with the advisory group to review rate and

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placement policies and procedures. At least one meeting shall be held prior to May of each year.'

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the original bill. It provides a statutory framework for the interdepart-5 mental committee that has been coordinating the ef-6 7 forts of the Department of Educational and Cultural 8 Services; the Department of Human Services; the De-9 partment of Mental Health and Mental Retardation; and 10 the Department of Corrections in contracting with 11 children's residential treatment centers. This amendment also establishes statutory duties for that com-12 13 mittee and creates an advisory group to meet with the 14 committee at least once every year. When the committee is operating in its capacity under this law it shall be designated as the Children's Residential Treatment Committee. That designation will distinguish this committee from any other interdepartmental 15 16 17 18 19 efforts in other subject areas.
