19 20	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
21 22	Sec. 1. 8 MRSA §146, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1983, c. 553, §4, is further amended to read:
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	1. <u>Boxing</u> . The commission shall have the sole direction, control and jurisdiction over all boxing contests and exhibitions, except that it shall have no jurisdiction over any amateur intercollegiate, interscholastic or intramural boxing contest or exhibition conducted under the direct auspices of a school, college or university, except as provided in section 147-A.
31 32 33 34 35	No boxing contests or exhibitions, except as provided in this chapter, may be held or conducted within this State unless the contest or exhibition is properly licensed by the commission and conducted in accord- ance with this chapter and the rules adopted pursuant

- 1 to this chapter, nor shall any closed circuit televi-2 sion showing of a boxing contest or exhibition 3 conducted, except under a license issued by the com-4 mission.
- 5 Sec. 2. 8 MRSA §§147-A and 147-B are enacted to 6 read:
- 7 §147-A. Headgear required; safety equipment
- 8 1. Headgear. No amateur boxing contest or exhi-9 bition may be held in this State unless the boxers wear protective headgear approved by the commission. 10
- 11 2. Other safety equipment. No amateur or professional boxing contest or exhibition may be held in 12 this State unless the following safety equipment is 13 14 used in the contest or exhibition:
- 15 A. Plastic safety mats;
- 16 B. Padded corner posts; and
- 17 C. Such other safety equipment as the commission may deem necessary for the protection of the 18 health and safety of the boxers. 19
- 20 §147-B. Head injuries
- 1. Examination. Any boxer who is rendered 21 22 unconscious or suffers head trauma during any boxing 23 contest or exhibition, as determined by the attending 24 ring physician, shall:
- 25 Be examined immediately by the attending ring 26 physician;
- 27 B. Undergo neurological and neuropsychological 28 examinations by a neurologist or neurosurgeon, including, but not limited to, a computed tomography or medically equivalent procedure; and 29 30
- Not participate in any boxing contest or ex-31 hibition until the results of any examination un-32 33 der paragraph B are reviewed by the commission.

2. Results of examination. The results of any examination conducted under subsection 1 shall become part of the boxer's permanent medical record as maintained by the commission and shall be used by the commission to determine whether the boxer should be permitted to participate in any future boxing contest or exhibition.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

Boxing is a dangerous activity that constitutes a severe health hazard to participants, including the risk of serious head injury. Numerous professional studies now document the extent of ocular and brain damage resulting from boxing. The purpose of this bill is to provide by law for some protections to contestants, including protective head gear and neurological examinations if a boxer is rendered unconscious.
