22 23	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1 <u>4. Registration plates. Both front and rear</u> 2 registration plates shall be safety attached or se-3 cured to the vehicle and plainly visible at all time.

## 6 §2504. Standard for rejection

7 A motor vehicle shall be rejected for violation 8 of the inspection standard for any one of the defi-9 ciencies set forth in this section =.

10 Nonfunctioning equipment. Any No person may 1. 11 operate on any highway or street any vehicle required to be registered in this State, nor may any vehicle 12 13 receive a certificate of inspection, as required by 14 this chapter, if any equipment as described in section 2502 that does not function, does not function 15 16 sufficiently for the safety of the general public or 17 is loose and not securely attached to the vehicle; 18 and.

19 Altered vehicles. No person may operate any 2. 20 vehicle required to be registered in this State upon 21 any highway or street, nor shall any vehicle receive a certificate of inspection, as required by this 22 23 chapter, if that vehicle has a bumper height of less 24 than 10 inches or a height in excess of the maximum 25 set by this subsection. Maximum bumper height as 26 shall be based on the manufacturers' gross vehicle weight rating. 27 Measurements shall be taken from a level surface to any point on the lower edge of the 28 horizontal bumper bar, exclusive of any bumper 29 main Measurements of vehicles not installed with 30 quards. 31 rear bumpers shall be taken from a level surface to 32 any point on the lowermost rearward vehicle frame extension, except that no vehicle may be modified to cause the vehicle body or chassis to come into con-33 34 35 tact with the ground or expose the fuel tank to dam-36 from collision or cause the wheels to come in aqe 37 contact with the body under normal operation, and that no part of the original suspension system be 38 disconnected. Nothing contained in this section may 39 40 prevent the installation of heavy duty equipment to include shock absorbers and overload springs; 41 and nothing contained in this section may prevent a per-42

1 son from operating a motor vehicle on a public way 2 with normal wear of the suspension system if normal 3 wear does not affect the control of the vehicle. 4 This section does not apply to motor vehicles that 5 are being lawfully towed on the highways of this 6 State. Maximum bumper heights are as follows:

7 FRONT REAR 8 Automobile 22 ins. 22 ins. 9 Vehicles 4,500 lbs. and under GVWR 26 ins. 24 ins. 10 Vehicles 4,501 lbs. to 11 7,500 lbs. GVWR 27 ins. 29 ins. 12 Vehicles 7,501 lbs. to 10,000 lbs. GVWR 28 ins. 13 30 ins.

14 3. Missing or obscured registration plates. No person may operate on any highway or street any vehi-15 16 cle required to be registered in this State, nor may any vehicle receive a certificate of inspection, as 17 18 required by this chapter, if the front and rear registration plates, as described in section 110, are 19 20 not safety attached or secured to the vehicle and 21 plainly visible. This subsection does not apply to 22 vehicles not required by law to display front and 23 rear registration plates.

## 24 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the proper display of both front and rear registration plates to receive a certificate of motor vehicle inspection. This requirement, along with the current display criteria, will address the concern about obscured license plates and plates blocked by snowplows or snowplow mounts.
