AN ACT to Appropriate Funds to the State Library for Support of the Information Exchange.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 27 MRSA §2, sub-§2, as enacted by PL
1979, c. 541, Pt. A, §185, is repealed and the fol-
lowing enacted in its place:
2. Exchanges. For the purpose of carrying out
this section, the State Librarian shall be empowered to provide the following:
A. Conduct a system of exchanges with other li-
braries and institutions of learning; and
B. Provide a service which will collect state
and national educational research and resources
to be made available to all State educators and
citizens.
