	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legisure do not become effective until 90 days after ournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
	Whereas, the Town of Millinocket voted on Nover 6, 1985, to annex certain lands to the town for purpose of economic expansion and residentia wth; and
	Whereas, this bill is vitally necessary to estable the new bounds of the municipality and begin despirent; and
the	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature se facts create an emergency within the meaning of Constitution of Maine and require the following islation as immediately necessary for the presentation.

 therefore,
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Two lots or parcels of land; annexed to Town of Millinocket. The following 2 lots or parcels of land bounded and described as follows and situated in township A Range 7, WELS are annexed to the Town of Millinocket:

- A certain lot or parcel of land situated in Township A, Range 7, WELS, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at an iron pin and post in the southerly sideline of Route 157 on the town line between Township A, Range 7 and Millinocket; thence S 69° 14' 24" E by and along the southerly sideline of Route 157 1,188 feet to an iron pin and post; thence S 5° 04' W by and along a painted line 4,291.33 feet an iron pin and post; thence N 77° 49' 46" W by and along a painted line 1,196.12 feet to an iron pin and post in the town line between the Township Range 7 and Millinocket; thence northerly by and along the town line 4,464 feet to the point of beginning containing 118.23 acres. Subject to the taking that parcel of land described in a taking of land for airport or landing field dated March 24, 1942, by the County of Penobscot and described in volume 1183, page 58 in Penobscot County Registry of Deeds.
- A certain parcel of land located in Township A, Range 7, WELS, Penobscot County, described as follows: Commencing at a point on the town line between Township A, Range 7, WELS and Millinocket and on the northerly side of the right-of-way for Route 157; thence northerly along the town line for a distance of 5,150 feet, more or less, to the northwest corner the Township A, Range 7, WELS; thence easterly along the north town line of the Township A, Range 7, WELS, for a distance of 1,820 feet, more or less, to point on the north town line of the Township A, Range 7, WELS; thence southerly for a distance of 5,110 feet, more or less, to a point on the northerly side of the right-of-way for Route 157; thence westerly by and along the northerly boundary of the right-of-way for Route 157 for a distance of 1,535

feet, more or less, to the point of beginning. The parcel containing 198 acres, more or less.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

6 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to annex 2 lots or parcels of land, one annexed by the Dyer Interests, Inc. and one annexed by the Cassidy Estate to the Town of Millinocket. The Town Council of Millinocket supported the annexation of both parcels and submitted them for referendum of the local voters on November 6, 1985. The voters approved the referendum question indicating their desire to offer the possibility of economic expansion and residential growth to the town's people.

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
