STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD
NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County
Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of Penobscot
County for the Year 1985.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Penobscot County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1985 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of

1 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
2 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation
3 of the public peace, health and safety; now,
4 therefore, be it

5 Sec. 1. Penobscot County; taxes apportioned.
6 Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax
7 on Penobscot County to be apportioned, assessed, collected
8 and applied to the purposes of paying debts
9 and necessary expenses of the county as authorized
10 herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar
11 year 1985:

15 Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized.
16 Resolved: That the following sums, based on the
17 county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of
18 State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by
19 the county during the calendar year 1985, in the specific
20 total amounts of expenditures for personal services,
21 contractual services, commodities and capital
22 expenditures for each account in the county budget:
