resident applicant's state of residence does not provide for the issuance of concealed weapons permits to
Maine residents, that applicant shall pay the fees otherwise provided for in this section.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently the state's nonresident concealed weapons fees are the highest in the country. This bill brings the state's fees more in line with other states and allows nonresidents to obtain a permit for a fee that is comparable to what a Maine resident would pay in another state. Since other states are considering reciprocal fee laws, this could benefit Maine residents as well.

This bill also allows for reciprocity on the issuance of a state concealed weapons permit to nonresidents who currently hold a valid permit in their state of residence at the fee charged a Maine resident in that state. Because another state has already determined the applicant is qualified to hold such a permit, it is not necessary to duplicate that state's efforts in doing the usual background checks.
