AN ACT to Deputize National Marine Fisheries Service Officers, United States Coast Guard Personnel and Law Enforcement Personnel of Other States as Department of Marine Resources Marine Patrol Officers and to Define Possession.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6001, sub-§34-A is enacted to read:
34-A. Possession. "Possession" means to have in one's custody or control, either personally or by another who is under one's control.
<pre>Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6022, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended to read:</pre>

6. Enforcement agreements. The commissioner may enter into reciprocal enforcement agreements with political subdivisions of the State and with other states, regional authorities and the Federal Government. Pursuant to these agreements, the commissioner may designate and deputize federal law enforcement personnel and law enforcement personnel from other states to enforce marine resource laws and rules. In that event, the commissioner shall designate the specific laws and rules to be enforced. Agents so deputized may enforce those laws and rules so designated by the commissioner. Agents so deputized by the commissioner shall have the powers of a marine patrol officer, as defined in section 6025.

The handling, shipment or any other means of dealing in seafood products, when those products involve any statutory or regulatory stipulations, such as size, should be under the supervision and responsibility of the individual who has primary interest in the product. The proposed definition provides that individuals who direct others to handle products also bear some responsibility.

At the present time, marine patrol officers are deputized as National Marine Fisheries Service Officers under terms of contracts held by the Department of Marine Resources with the National Marine Fisheries Service. It will be beneficial to the State and the commercial fishing industry if the Commissioner of Marine Resources had the statutory authority to cross-deputize National Marine Fisheries Service Officers, Coast Guard personnel and law enforcement agents from other states. This means that these federal officers will have the authority to investigate and document violations of state marine laws and rules as specified by the commissioner. This will add significantly to state enforcement capabilities at no cost to the State.
