24 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
25 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
26 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

27 Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate un-
28 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

29 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-
30 dent to the operation of the department will become
31 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985;
32 and

33 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
34 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
35 the Constitution of Maine and require the following

1 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 Allocation of Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund. Accumulated surplus and income to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the current fiscal year from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, and July 1, 1986 to June 30, 1987 shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule.
