This bill amends the definition of basic necessity in the general assistance program to include circumstances in which a family faces imminent foreclosure on their home. In at least one recent case assistance with a mortgage payment was denied to a family causing them to lose their right to redeem their home. The municipality argued that the family would not be immediately without shelter as a result of the foreclosure even though the consequence of the refusal would be that they would lose their home in the near future.
