Study of rental housing. Resolved: That the Maine State Housing Authority, with the assistance of the State Planning Office, is directed to conduct a study and report to the review committee, as established by this resolve, by January 1, 1986, on current regulatory practices and conditions of rental housing in the various localities within the State.

In conducting the study, the authority is directed to seek the cooperation and assistance of the Maine Municipal Association, the Association of Building Code Enforcement Officers, organizations and representatives of landlords and of tenants and other agencies or organizations with special interest or expertise on the subject.

The study shall be confined to fact finding and data analysis. Conclusions and recommendations will be left to the review committee established by this resolve. The purpose of the study is to gather, compile and analyze relevant information, especially in the following areas:

- 1. Current ordinances in the various towns regulating conditions in rental housing and current enforcement practices to promote safe and decent rental housing;
- 2. Statistical and anecdotal information illustrating the extent and seriousness of substandard conditions in rental housing and the availability and affordability of adequate rental housing in the State; and
- 3. Alternative methods for achieving adequate and affordable rental housing and compliance with desirable standards for safe and decent rental housing, including, but not limited to, educational programs, legislation litigation and financial incentives; and be it further

Review committee established. Resolved: That a Review Committee on Rental Housing Conditions and Standards be established, with membership to be appointed as follows: The Senate and House of Representatives chairmen of the Joint Standing Committee on Legal Affairs, or their designees, and 5 other

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	members to be appointed by them, including another Legislator, a representative of municipalities, representative of landlords, a representative of code enforcement officers and a representative of tenants. The agencies and organizations performing the study and the Office of Legislative Assistants shall serve as staff for the review committee.
