	MAINE COMMISSION	N FOR MEN
§7	101. Commission established	<u>d</u>

The Maine Commission for Men, established by section 12004, subsection 11, referred to in this chapter as the "commission," shall be an independent commission. The commission shall promote, carry out and coordinate programs designed to improve opportunities for men in the State.

§7102. Membership

 The commission shall consist of 17 members, including 9 appointed by the Governor, 4 appointed by the President of the Senate and 4 appointed by the Speaker of the House. In making these appointments to the commission, the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall consider and appoint residents of the State who have a knowledge of problems facing Maine men and who provide leadership in programs or activities which are carried out to improve opportunities for men. The members of the commission, chosen from throughout the State, shall include, but not be limited to, representatives of minority, low income, youth and elderly groups.

§7103. Term of office

Members shall be appointed for 2-year terms, except of those members first appointed, 5 appointed by the Governor, 2 appointed by the President of the Senate and 2 appointed by the Speaker of the House shall be appointed for 2-year terms and the remainder shall be appointed for one-year terms. The term of office of each member shall be designated at the time of appointment.

Members may serve after the expiration of their terms until their successors have taken office. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House may terminate the membership of their respective appointees for good and just cause and the reason for the termination shall be communicated in writing to each member whose term is so terminated. The appointment of any member of the commission shall be terminated if the member is absent from 3 consecutive meetings without communicating good and just cause to the chairman.

1 §7104. Vacancies

Members appointed to fill vacancies occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which their predecessor was appointed shall serve only for the remainder of that term and shall be appointed by the same person who appointed their predecessor. Any vacancy on the commission shall not affect its powers.

8 §7105. Chairman

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The Governor shall select from among the members
a chairman and a vice-chairman, both of whom shall
serve for one year. These selections shall be made
each year prior to the first meeting of the commission. The chairman may appoint subcommittees.

§7106. Powers and duties

The commission may to advise and consult with the Governor and Legislature about, and assist them in improving, opportunities for Maine men by:

- 18 1. Research. Carrying out research programs

- 21 2. Activities. Promoting and coordinating ac-22 tivities on state and local levels designed to meet 23 the problems of men;
- 3. Advocate. Serving as an advocate for Maine
 men by making recommendations on proposed budgetary,
 legislative and policy actions to the Governor, Legislature and to other officials of State Government
 and Federal Government with respect to state and federal policies, programs and other activities affecting or relating to the men of Maine;
- 31 4. Information. Informing the public about the 32 presence or absence of opportunities for Maine men;
- 5. Meetings. Conducting public hearings, conferences, workshops and other such meetings to obtain information about, discuss and publicize the needs of and solutions to problems of men; and
