19 the Highway Fund for the Fiscal Year

22 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
23 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
24 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

25 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
26 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

27 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will  
28 become due and payable prior to June 30, 1985; and

29 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
30 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of  
31 the Constitution of Maine and require the following  
32 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-  
33 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
34 therefore,

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
2 follows:

3 Sec. 1. Additional allocation of Highway Fund.  
4 Income to the Highway Fund for the fiscal year from  
5 July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, shall be segregated,  
6 apportioned and disbursed as designated in the fol-  
7 lowing schedule.

36	may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-	
37	ficer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-

4       **Sec. 3. Encumbered balance at year end.** At the  
5 end of the fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall  
6 not be carried more than once.

7       **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited  
8 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-  
9 proved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

11       The purpose of this bill is to make additional  
12 allocations of the Highway Fund for the fiscal year  
13 ending June 30, 1985.

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
