13 STATEMENT OF FACT

Current funding of the Highway Maintenance Resurfacing Program provides funds only after July 1st of each year, even though the paving season begins in May in most areas of the State. The department loses 6 to 8 weeks of early paving under existing funding procedures. This bill will be a one-time allocation to fund the 1985 summer program of maintenance paving and to allow it to begin as soon as weather permits. The funds for this program included in the 1985-86 budget year will then be used to fund the summer 1986 Maintenance Paving Program, again be-All future budget years will then ginning in May. fund this activity at the end, rather than the beginning, of the fiscal year for a more efficient and effective expenditure of available funds. Beina to start paving in May allows a greater percentage of paving to be completed prior to the summer tourist season which is so critical to the state's economy.
