AN ACT to Require District Courts to Send  
Copies of all Orders and Judgments to  
the Parties of Record.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 MRSA §182 is enacted to read:

§182. Copies of orders and judgments

In any action in a District Court, the clerk shall, as soon as practicable, send a copy of any order or judgment of the court to all persons who are parties of record in the action at the time of pleading. In actions brought under Title 19, those copies shall be sent by certified mail to the person's last known address. In all other actions, those copies shall be sent by regular mail to the person's last known address.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require that in all District Court actions, certified copies of any judgments or orders be mailed to all persons who are parties of record in the action.

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
