## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 112TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " "to H.P. 552, L.D. 824,
Bill, "AN ACT Concerning Access to Medical Care for
Persons without Adequate Health Insurance."

10 Amend the bill by striking out everything after 11 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the 12 following:

13 'Sec. 1. Findings. The Legislature finds that 14 access to medical care is limited or unavailable to 15 many citizens of the State, whose income, resources 16 or health insurance is insufficient to meet the cost 17 of necessary medical services and who are ineligible 18 for federally-assisted medical care services. The 19 Legislature recognizes that inadequate health coverage discourages the prevention of serious medical conditions, creates severe hardship and suffering for 20 21 the individual in need of care and leads to increased 22 23 of costly tertiary care, particularly in-patient use 24 hospital care.

25 Sec. 2. Study on access to medical care. The 26 Human Services Development Institute of the Center for Research and Advanced Study at the University of 27 28 Southern Maine is directed to conduct a study on the 29 extent to which Maine citizens are without adequate 30 medical care because of their lack of income and re-31 sources and to report its findings, including any 32 necessary legislation, to the Joint Standing Commit-33 tee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and the 34 Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources by March 35 1, 1986.

36 The Department of Human Services and the Bureau 37 of Insurance shall cooperate with the Human Services 38 Development Institute of the Center for Research and 39 Advanced Study by providing access to records, rules, COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 552, L.D. 824

1 policies and data, except for those items which they 2 are legally obligated to keep confidential. · - - -

The study shall be confined to fact-finding, data analysis and the presentation of policy alternatives to address those needs identified by the study. Based on the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resourcs shall make recommendations.

10 The purpose of the study shall be to compile and 11 analyze relevant information in the following areas:

12 1. The extent to which citizens of the State 13 lack adequate health insurance to cover the cost of 14 medically necessary care;

15 2. The extent to which citizens lacking adequate 16 insurance are without income and resources to pay for 17 this care themselves;

18 3. The nature and extent of health problems 19 among the uninsured and underinsured populations;

20 4. The extent to which the uninsured and 21 underinsured are medically disadvantaged by their 22 lack of income, resources or adequate health insur-23 ance; and

5. Policy alternatives to address problems of
inadequate access to health care as determined
through this study.

27 The Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations 28 and the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources 29 shall:

Conduct a public hearing on the study;

The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 6 7 purposes of this Act. 8 1985-86 q HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF 10 Medical Care Administration All Other \$25,000' 11 12 STATEMENT OF FACT 13 The purpose of this amendment is to fund a study 14 to be conducted by the Human Services Development In-15 stitute of the Center for Research and Advanced Study 16 at the University of Southern Maine on the extent to 17 which Maine citizens are without adequate medical 18 care because of their lack of income and resources.

19 Findings must be reported to the Joint Standing Com-20 mittee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and 21 the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources by 22 March 1, 1986.
