17 AN ACT to Extend the National School
18 Breakfast Program Availability to
19 Maine School Children.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 20-A MRSA §6602, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1981,
24 c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

25 1. Participation. A public school shall partic-
26 ipate in the National School Lunch Program. It shall
27 provide Type A meals as determined by the United
28 States Department of Agriculture. A public school
29 designated as especially needy shall be required to
30 participate in the National School Breakfast Program
31 by July 1, 1986. The commissioner shall designate a
32 school as especially needy whenever 50% or more of
33 the children in attendance are eligible for free or
34 reduced price meals under applicable federal regula-
35 tions.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill requires public schools with a high
3 percentage of needy children enrolled to participate
4 in the National School Breakfast Program by July 1,
5 1986.

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
