A. The obligation of any capital expenditures by or on behalf of a health care facility which is associated with the addition of a health service which was not offered on a regular basis by or on behalf of the facility within the 12-month period prior to the time the services would be offered; or

1. Categories of projects eligible for waiver.
A hospital may apply for a waiver of the certificate
of need review requirements otherwise imposed by this
chapter with respect to the following categories of
projects:

38 A. New health services involving any capital ex 39 penditure less than \$300,000; or

1	B. New health services with 3rd year annual op-
2	erating costs of at least the expenditure minimum
3	for annual operating costs but less than
4	\$250,000.
5	2. Conditions of waiver. As a condition of re-
6	ceipt of a waiver of certificate of need review, the
7	hospital shall not be entitled to any positive ad-
8	justments to its financial requirements pursuant to
9	section 396-D, subsection 5, or section 396-K, nor
10	shall the hospital be subject to any negative adjust-
11	ments to its financial requirements pursuant to these
12	sections.
13	3. Waiver process. Any hospital may file a re-
14	quest for waiver with the department and Maine Health
15	Care Finance Commission describing the proposed
16	project and its projected associated capital costs
17	and projected operating costs, as appropriate. With-
18	in 15 days following receipt of the hospital's waiver
19	request and other information, if requested, the de-
20	partment shall issue its waiver determination.

6. <u>Hospital projects</u>. Notwithstanding subsections 1, 4 and 5, the department may not issue a cer-1 2 tificate of need for a project which is 3 subject to the provisions of section 396-D, subsection 5, and 4 5 section 396-K, if the associated costs exceed the 6 amount which the commission has determined will have 7 been credited to the Certificate of Need Development 8 Account pursuant to section 396-K, after accounting 9 for previously approved projects. A project shall not 10 be denied solely on the basis of exceeding the amount 11 remaining in the Certificate of Need Development Ac-12 count in a particular payment year, and shall be held 13 for further consideration by the department in the 14 first applicable review cycle beginning after the 15 Certificate of Need Development Account is credited 16 with additional amounts. For purposes of this subsection, a project may be held for a final decision be-17 18 yond the time frames set forth in section 307, sub-19 sections 3 and 4.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is intended to modify several elements of the Maine Certificate of Need Act to recognize the impact of the Maine Health Care Finance Commission law or the certificate of need process.

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25 Sections 1 and 3 allow hospitals the option of 26 obtaining waivers on certificate of need reviews for new services when the capital expenditures are less 27 28 \$300,000 or the projected annual operating cost than 29 for the 3rd year is greater than \$135,000 but less As a condition of such a waiver, a 30 than \$250,000. 31 hospital is not entitled to a positive adjustment to 32 its financial requirements as determined by the Maine 33 Health Care Finance Commission.

34 Section 2 eliminates certificate of need review 35 authority for so-called "Category C" health services, 36 which do not involve capital expenditures or signifi-37 cant operating costs. 1 Section 4 allows the Department of Human Services 2 to hold projects, which would otherwise be denied due 3 to insufficient funds in the Certificate of Need De-4 velopment Account for consideration in the following 5 year.

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
