B. "Public place" means any primary or secondary school, retail store, grocery store, drug store, laundromat, library, museum, hair salon or barber shop, but does not include any bar, cocktail lounge or private club.

- C. "Public proceedings" means the transactions of any functions affecting any or all citizens of the State by any of the following:
 - (1) The Legislature and its committees and subcommittees;
 - (2) Any board or commission of any state agency or authority, the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine and any of its committees and subcommittees, the Administrative Council of the University of Maine, the Board of Trustees of the Maine Maritime Academy and any of its committees and subcommittees; and
 - (3) Any board, commission, agency or authority of any county, municipality, school district or any other political or administrative subdivision.
- D. "Smoking" includes carrying or having in one's possession a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or other object giving off or containing any substance giving off smoke.
- 2. Smoking prohibited. No person may smoke tobacco or any other substance in any public proceeding held inside, indoor public waiting area or public place, except as otherwise provided in this section.
- 3. No smoking signs posted. There shall be posted in conspicuous places in any place where smoking is prohibited by this section an adequate number of "no smoking" signs.
- 35 <u>4. Exception. Smoking at a public proceeding</u>
 36 <u>shall be allowed, provided all members present have</u>
 37 <u>given their consent for others to smoke.</u>

STATEMENT OF FACT

2	The purpose of this bill is to ban smoking in in-
3	door waiting areas, such as lobbies of professional
4	offices, banks or other areas where members of the
5	public are required to wait for the performance of a
6	service and in certain public places such as retail
7	stores, museums and public schools.
