14 15 16	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
17 18 19 20	AN ACT to Clarify the Status of Newspaper Carriers under the Unemployment Compensation Act.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	26 MRSA §1043, sub-§11, ¶F, as amended by PL 1981, c. 633, is further amended to read:
25	F. The term "employment" shall not include:
26 27 28 29 30	(1) Service performed in the employ of this State, or of any political subdivision thereof, or of any instrumentality of this State or its political subdivisions, except as provided by this subsection;
31 32 33 34	(2) Service performed in the employ of the United States Government or an instrumentality of the United States immune under the Constitution of the United States from the

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contributions imposed by this chapter, except that on and after January 1, 1940 to the extent that the Congress of the United States has permitted states to require any instrumentalities of the United States to make payments into an unemployment compensation fund under a state unemployment compensation or employment security law, all of the provisions of this chapter shall be applicable to such instrumentalities and to services performed for such instrumentalities, in the same manner, to the same extent and on the same terms as to all other employers, employing units, individuals and services. If this State shall not be certified for any year by the Secretary of Labor under section 3304 of the Federal Internal Revenue Code, the payments required of such instrumentalities with respect to such year shall be refunded by the commissioner from fund in the same manner and within the same period as is provided in section 1225, subsection 5, with respect to contributions erroneously collected;

- (3) Service with respect to which unemployment compensation is payable under an unemployment compensation system or employment security system established by an Act of Congress. The commissioner is authorized and directed to enter into agreements with the proper agencies under such Act of Congress, which agreements shall become effective 10 days after publication thereof in the manner provided in section 1082, subsection 2, regulations, to provide reciprocal treatment to individuals who have, after acquiring potential rights to benefits under this chapter, acquired rights to unemployment compensation under such Act of Congress, or who after acquiring potential rights to unemployment compensation under such Act of Congress, acquired rights to benefits under this chapter;
- (4) Agricultural labor as defined in subsection 1, except as provided in paragraph A-2;

3	STATEMENT OF FACT
4 5 6 7 8 9 10	The Unemployment Compensation Act presently exempts newspaper carriers under 18 years of age from coverage. Very similar part-time work is done by persons over 18 years of age who deliver to rural newspaper routes using automobiles. In both cases, the job is only a modest supplement to family income. There appears to be no reason to treat these 2 situations differently.
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
